PUBLICATION POLICY

The reputation of the Rajagiri Journal of Social Development depends on the trust of its readers, authors, researchers, peer reviewers and editors. This trust is enhanced by describing as explicitly as possible the journal's policies to ensure the ethical treatment of all participants in the publication process.

The Editorial Board would select an article to publish in the journal, through a peer review process which is objective, and fair involving ethical principles and decisions. The Journal would strictly seek original work that has not been previously published or currently not under review at another journal/conference. The authors are expected to give an undertaking to this effect at the time of submission of an article. All authors are responsible for the quality, accuracy, and ethics of the work.

Possible Misconducts related to the work submitted for publication

- Falsification of data.
- Plagiarism
- Improprieties of authorship.
- Misappropriation of the ideas of others.
- Violation of generally accepted research practices.
- Inappropriate behavior in relation to misconduct.

The editorial decision would be final. If a published paper is subsequently found to have errors or major flaws, the Editor would take the responsibility of correcting the written record in the publication.
